Many people enthusiastically volunteered for The Homing Project, wanting to build. They got a taste of construction in April when forty volunteers assembled the prefabricated micro-houses at the village site in a


There will be a 30 ft by 30 ft dining patio composed of hundreds of pavers. Ever laid pavers? If not, you can learn. In addition, the dining patio needs a metal ramada assembled along with its six

- 2) The 10 ft by 12 ft laundry shed will be built on site. Dave Tonsing, the Team Leader is asking for 3-4 experienced handymen/carpenters for his team.3) Landscaping will be done the first week of October. This means going to the nursery to pick up our
- order of large trees and many medium sized bushes and succulents; planting all the above, and then connecting them to the irrigation system. (Irrigation system and trees are paid for by a Pima County Extreme Heat Grant.) This will require 8-10 people.
- 4) Install an opaque privacy **fence** around the perimeter and install three gates. This will require 5-8 people.

 5) Lay the stabilized **decomposed granite nathway** between the buildings. This will require 6-8
- 5) Lay the stabilized **decomposed granite pathway** between the buildings. This will require 6-8 people, preferably bringing their own wheelbarrows. If you're interested in being the team leader, please note that when you volunteer.
- 6) Finish the **inside of a small kitchen.** Install the stove vent, insulation, wallboard, and then paint. This will require 3-6 people. If you're interested in being the team leader, please note that when you volunteer.
- 7) **Pour a sand volleyball court**. The site has already been dug out for this. If you're interested in being the team leader, please note that when you volunteer.
- 8) **Install electrical panels and AC's**. Not that complicated we believe. It does not involve any hook ups to just attach the panel and to put in the air conditioners just like window ACs.

While we do not have exact dates for the different opportunities right now, please do sign up to volunteer. As soon as the final electrical permit is received, the trenches for the electrical lines can be covered and work can begin to finish everything else. **Please sign up to volunteer** for the opportunities that you would like to participate in. We will let you know the exact work dates for each area as soon as we know when work can proceed, which we anticipate will be sometime in September.



Raj Garewal's Reflections on The Homing Project By Kiarra Celaya

With the village's grand opening quickly approaching, it's time to reflect on just how far we've come. A few years ago, the thought of opening a village to aid the vulnerable was only an idea.

In an interview, Raj Garewal recounted the early moments of the project recalling how, "The timing was just right." Raj had returned home to Arizona after working with the unhoused communities in California, and his mother, Kristin (Kris) Olson-Garewal, had recently retired from her lengthy medical career, when their discussion of the unjust and problematic approach being taken with the growing homeless population in Tucson sparked inspiration. Having seen what other states had accomplished providing small homes and vital services to support the unhoused, Raj and Kris thought, "That might work here." Soon after, the pair hit the ground running; although it wasn't easy, nevertheless, they persevered. Now, in August 2025, after countless hours of effort, dedication and commitment by volunteers recruited to their project, a village is soon coming into existence. So, when the ribbon is cut and the doors open, what once was a simple idea shared

A Joyful July: Art Auction Fundraiser Shines Bright with \$11,000 Raised!

The event was the brainchild of artists Mary Spencer and Bonnie Mroczkowski, who came up with the entire show's layout. They then approached Shannon Riggs of the Made in Tucson Market & the Historic Fourth Avenue Coalition who graciously donated their space for a full three days for the event. Then the event was pitched to The Homing Project as the beneficiary, who loved the idea. Jennifer Leinhos, Treasurer and volunteer for The Homing Project jumped on board and she and Mary started the work in earnest.
